## Wytham Woods

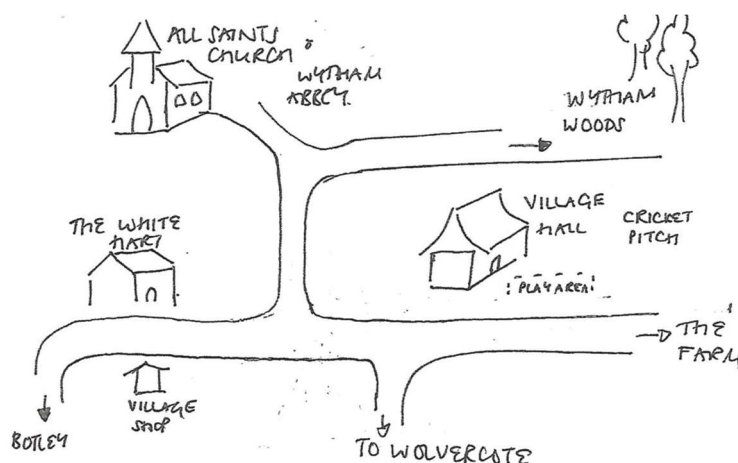
Oxford University's 'Living Laboratory', this stunning woodland is a magical place and famous across the globe for its contribution to climate change research.

## The Hope ffennell Trust

The trust provides non-means-tested grants to children and young people living in Wytham. Grants are made, against application, to support education in the widest sense, for example, books / equipment for further education; visits, including residential ones to enhance coursework; music, dance and sports coaching. The trust was formed in the early 1970's following the closure of the village school and is managed by a team of Trustees and a Clerk.

## Bins ...and badgers!

Bins are emptied on Thursdays and alternate black and green each week. The green food waste caddy is collected every week. While bins are usually emptied mid to late morning, if you have a brown garden waste bin it will need to be at the curb-side by 7am!

Some Wytham residents like to rummage through the bins - by which we mean the badgers! If you can avoid putting your bins out until Thursday morning this is advisable as the badgers are very cunning and will take the liberty of emptying your bins for you.



### Bus Service

Wytham is part of the Science Transit Shuttle route which serves Wytham Village, Oxford City Centre and The John Radcliffe Hospital, with several convenient stops in-between.

The ST2 service runs roughly every hour and you can catch the bus from the University Field Station or just outside the Village Hall (Monday to Friday)

### Village Shop

We have a small but well stocked shop in the village just opposite the pub which is handy for essentials. Graham and Shirley who run the shop also offer tea, coffee, sandwiches and other foods which can be enjoyed in their garden, particularly over the summer months or made to takeaway. The shop is open Monday - Saturday 9am-5pm (except Wednesdays 9am-12pm).

### Postal Collection

Wytham has a post box located just outside the village shop. The last collection of the day is at 4pm Mon-Fri. The nearest post office is located in Kidlington.
